Kerala Agricultural University Students Explore Research at ICAR-CAZRI RRS, Jaisalmer

A group of 112 B.Sc. (Hons) Agriculture students from College of Agriculture, Vellanikkara, along with three faculty members, visited the ICAR-CAZRI Regional Research Station, Jaisalmer, as part of their institutional study tour. The visit aimed to provide students with first-hand exposure to agricultural research and sustainable farming practices in arid regions. Dr. R.S.
