Training on Livelihood Improvement of Tribal Communities of Dungarpur through Integrated Resource Management (25-27 August, 2014) Dungarpur (Rajasthan)



Central Arid Zone Research Institute, Jodhpur has organized a three days training program on "Livelihood improvement of tribal communities of Dungarpur through integrated resource management" under Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) from 25th to 27th August, 2014 at Dungarpur. The course was organized at Krishi Vigyan Kendra – Faloj. More than 60 tribal farmers including 20 women participated in the training program. Dr. S.N.Ojha, Program Coordinator KVK Faloj was the chief guest of the inaugural function of the training. More than 15 lectures were delivered during the training beside practical/demonstrations. The topics covered during the training were integrated watershed management, soil resource and nutrient management, land use planning, improved agronomic practices for *kharif* and *rabi* crops, livestock production and management, preparation of nutritious food through low-cost inputs etc. Farmers were demonstrated the technique of preparation of vermi compost and management practices for goat keeping and poultry breeding. A lecture was also arranged from the lead bank of Dungarpur on various loan facilities available with the nationalized banks for agriculture-related activities. Information was also imparted on Kisan Credit Card, Crop and Livestock insurance etc. On this occasion 500 mango seedlings (Mallika) were also distributed to farmers of Berania watershed.
